Sacrament of Reconciliation:

Confessions are available before each Mass at all churches.

Sacrament of Matrimony:

In order for a Catholic to enter a sacramentally valid marriage, he/she must respect and follow the Church's discipline regarding this sacrament. Call the parish office for specific information. Normally, about six months should be allowed to prepare for this sacred covenant. Parish registration is necessary.

Sacrament of Confirmation:

Students are required to be registered in the parish & be participating in the parish Rel. Ed. Program. Confirmation classes are separate and obligatory.

Sacrament of Baptism:

Parents are required to attend one Baptism preparation class (seminar). Baptism is celebrated within the weekend Mass. Call the parish offices for a seminar date.

A REED SWAYED BY THE WIND

John the Baptist had been expecting a violent judgment day. It would be initiated by the coming Messiah with fire. He must have been amazed and confused when the pacifist Jesus did not match his expectations. After his imprisonment he sent some of his disciples to press the issue. Would Jesus provoke a revolution? Was he the promised agent of divine vengeance?

Jesus may be referring to John's vacillation when he muses about a "reed swayed by the wind." Christ explained to John's followers that his notion of the Messiah was more in line with Isaiah's prophecy of a bringer of peace and healing in the first reading.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Recognizing that only 30% of all Catholics believe in the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched a three-year eucharistic revival that will culminate with the National Eucharistic Congress 2024 in Indianapolis.

The Revival is divided into three parts:

YEAR OF DIOCESAN REVIVAL: June 19, 2022 – June 11, 2023

This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to respond to the Lord's personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through eucharistic congresses and events.

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL: June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS; July 17 – 21, 2024; Indianapolis, Indiana

At this historic event, more than 80,000 Catholics of all ages will gather in Indianapolis to reconsecrate their hearts to the source and summit of our faith.

Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith: his Real Presence in the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery here in the United States.

BEGINNING FRIDAY, JANUARY 6, 2023, SACRED HEART, COVINGTON, WILL CELEBRATE FIRST FRIDAY MASS AT 11:00AM, FOLLOWED BY 8 HOURS OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION, ENDING WITH BENEDICTION. AS JESUS CANNOT BE LEFT ALONE, A SIGN-UP SHEET CAN BE FOUND IN THE VESTIBULE TO ALLOW PARISHIONERS TO VOLUNTEER FOR EACH HOUR.
